1.1. The Annual Better Care Fund Plan is due for submission on 3rd May 2016. This reports aims to assure the Governing Body of the process for development and sign off of the plan and associated planning template that describes the funding flows and National Conditions and Metrics (both documents attached).

2. MAIN BODY OF REPORT

2.1. The Timetable for the submission of Better Care Fund Planning for 2016/17 was as follows:-

- 2.2 As outlined above the deadlines for the 2nd, 10th and 21st March were all met. Feedback from the first draft of the high level narrative plan was received on 5th April. Wolverhampton was deemed to be "low risk" and was one of 10 areas to be "Approved with Support". The other 4 areas within the region were not approved. The view from the regional office was that with some amendments and / or additions to the plan that they would be recommending to the national team that Wolverhampton's be fully approved upon the final submission.
- 2.3 The plan was required to be signed off by the Health and Well Being Board on 27th April. Governing Body delegated CCG approval to Dr Helen Hibbs and Claire Skidmore.
- 2.4 In order for the plan to be presented at Health and Well Being Board a final draft was circulated for comment on Monday 25th April following a briefing to Councillor Samuels earlier that day. Any comments were to be returned by Wednesday 27th

April to enable any final amendments to be made to the plan for submission on Tuesday 3rd May, following the Bank Holiday.

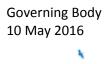
