Enclosure 1 Internal Audit Report 2018/19: Delegated Commissioning – Recommendations and Implications

The CCG will report patient list sizes to the Primary Care Operational Group on a quarterly basis via the Primary Care Dashboard. This will highlight areas for discussion and can be triangulated with other sources of quality and performance data. Implication - Regularly assessing practices on quality, safety and performance: A Primary care dashboard is being developed by the Business Intelligence team and is now a draft form. A workshop is taking place on 18th March to review the usability of the content of the dashboard and how the data can be presented. Regularly assessing practices on quality, safety and performance: A Primary care dashboard will show a high level view of all GP practices based on patient safety and will include CQC ratings, complaints, serious incidents, performa referrals workforce, patient list sizes and financial income. Head of Primary care dashboard will be shared for comment in May with a
view to approval being sought from PCCC in June 2019
