This has allowed the committees to assess the breadth of their work and ensure that appropriate attention is given to each of the areas of responsibility in their terms of reference.
- 2.2. As well as providing the Governing Body with assurance on the work of the Committees, the content of the annual reports has been used to support the Chief Officer in preparing the Annual Governance Statement, which forms part of the Annual Report. This includes brief details of work undertaken by each of the committees that relate to the CCG's overall governance framework.
- 2.3. Each of the committee's reports are attached for comment by the Governing Body. The Remuneration Committee is required to report in its own right as part of the Annual Report and has therefore not produced a separate report. Each of the reports will be published on the CCG's website.
