<b>KEY POINTS:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The board received updates regarding information technology in general practice, feedback following visits to Voluntary Training Schemes,</li><li>• The board considered an options paper presenting opportunities to support the locum workforce and concluded that further discussion was required with Clinical Leads from each area. The focus for clinical leads will be to explore the likely content of a local support programme for Locum GPs recognising the arrangements already in place in Dudley.</li><li>• Funding proposals were approved for a GP Mid Career Scheme, GP Welcome Back/Legacy Scheme Scheme, GPFV Training Hub Funding, Reception &amp; Clerical Training Proposals.</li><li>• A separate report regarding Online Consultation was considered following engagement with PCN Clinical Directors from across all CCGs and concluded that at this time there is no single preferred delivery model for the Black Country and West Birmingham. Funds were therefore approved in line with CCG proposals that had been considered in August 2019. However, a further piece of work will be undertaken to identify the future potential solution.</li><li>• The board received an update on PCN Development and the opportunity to share approaches taken to social prescribing, leadership development programmes were due to be publicised and other development programmes had now commenced. Formal reporting to NHSE/Board will take place to demonstrate progress from December 2019.</li><li>• Items presenting greatest risk were Online Consultation, 111 direct booking, suitability of estate to accommodate the new/ expanding workforce.</li></ul>
