Contracting & Procurement Update

CCM442

Members of the Committee were provided with an update of key contractual issues in relation to Month 6 (September 2015) activity and finance performance.

- Contracting 2015/16
 - There has been a delay in the official sign off of the contract for Birmingham and Solihull Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust. This has been has been escalated within the organisation and a deadline for signoff provided.

Royal Wolverhampton NHS Trust

- Percentage of A&E attendances where the patient was admitted transferred or discharged within 4 hours – The Trust achieved 93% against a 95% target. A contract performance notice has now been issued and we are in the process of reviewing their plans to address this.
- Cancer targets The Trust achieved 75% against an 85% target for service users waiting no more than two months (62 days) from urgent GP referral to first definitive treatment for cancer. Areas of concern continue to be around urology and tertiary referrals. The Trust achieved 85% against a 90% target for service users waiting no more than 62 days from referral from an NHS screening service to first definitive treatment for all cancers. A contract performance notice has been issued to support the recovery of both targets.
- Referral to treatment within 18 weeks The Trust is achieving 92% against a target of 92%. However, at speciality level the Trust are failing to achieve in General Surgery, Trauma & Orthopaedics and Urology. The Trust has been asked to review their plans in relation to this.
- E-Discharge Contract Performance Notice An agreed remedial action plan remains in place and is being closely monitored following continued poor performance.
- Performance/Sanctions 2015/16 total sanctions levied to date is £451,640.
- Activity and Finance: Acute For Month 6 there is a variance against the plan with a current position of an over performance at £5.7m with Cannock equating to £5.39m Wolverhampton equating to a positive position of £0.21m.
